NESAA Receives \$750 Grant from the Elroy and Terry Krumholz Foundation to support Spay/Neuter Programs on Cape Cod

November 14th, 2011, Osterville, MA - The New England Society for Abandoned Animals (NESAA) is pleased to announce that it received a \$750 grant from the Elroy and Terry Krumholze Foundation of New York to be used to support the costs of spay/neuter surgeries for its *Free Spay/Neuter for low-income communities* program. This will benefit 20 animals, their owners and the community at large.

Support from the Krumholz Foundation will allow NESAA to make an even deeper impact on the prevention of pet abandonment and overpopulation in the region, supporting its programs to offer free and reduced cost spay/neuter services, shelter and medical care, and education to the public on the basic needs for some of the most innocent creatures in the world, cats and kittens, ready to give that wonderful unconditional love to future owners.

Deborah Doe, Founder and President of the New England Society for Abandoned Animals (NESAA) said: "*This year we have seen the highest intake of animals. To date we have already supported 790 animals and we still have a few months left to go. Our medical and sterilization expenses have already surpassed last year's. Support from individuals and from foundations like the Krumholz Foundation are very welcome so we are very grateful for this support.*"

NESAA is a charitable 501 (c) (3) organization, registered with the Massachusetts Attorney General's Office, with the following mission: To advocate, protect and rescue, abandoned and abused animals using a proactive, humane approach. NESAA is committed to its "no kill" programs, increasing community awareness and creating progressive changes in animal welfare.

NESAA gets called often to help take care of animals that have been abandoned or not well cared for. In 2010 alone, it supported 1,082 animals with either Direct Rescue and Care or Spay/Neuter assistance for community members who cannot afford it, and at any given day, it typically has 50 to 100 cats and kittens (and occasionally dogs) in its care.
